BEAUTY AT EYE LEVEL: GARDEN STRUCTURES

June is a warm, busy month, and gardeners are busily creating beautiful vignettes, secret gardens, and quiet retreats. But when many gardeners stand back and look at their gardens, something is lacking; one simple element: visual interest at eye level.

A garden can be beautifully planted at ground level and still lack vertical interest. Many people are only comfortable planting in the soil or in pots and are uncomfortable using an accent piece to make a bold vertical statement or they simply don't think of it. Vertical structures provide garden "bones", very important to a well rounded garden.



One of the most classic upright garden structures is the wooden metal arch. An arch is the epitome of good garden bones, evoking images leisurely strolls through a rose smothered portal into a beautiful secluded garden. This brings to

mind a point about arbors: they are meant to be used to pass through, usually two people shoulder to shoulder. An arch is dramatic when incorporated this way, much more effective than an arch placed against a solid object that no one can pass through. However, an arch used with a faux garden painting or with shrubs trimmed to give an illusion of depth can be a clever focal point.

Statuary, containers, sundials, and other ornamental objects can be placed on tall pedestals for vertical interest in the garden as well.



Other vertical garden elements used artistically are large rose domes and smaller clematis domes. These can be round or some topiary forms have a square base narrowing to a top finial.

A dome with an 18" diameter is placed over a young or thinned and pruned climbing rose. The branches can be trained up and around the dome, allowing more health giving sunlight to reach the branches, resulting in more

abundant blooms.

An umbrella tuteur is similar, only with an umbrella shaped top section. The climbing rose grows up the center, pours over the top and is allowed to hang over several feet, making a spectacular picture at its peak spring bloom. *That* is vertical visual interest.

Flat trellises are useful for supporting all sorts of climbing plants next to a fence or wall. They can be custom made, from simple to more ornate, to suit almost any situation. Use more than one to fill a blank wall.

Gardens are better for having vertical structures and climbing plans as part of their composition. Roses and climbing vines benefit from having their branches



fixed to sturdy supports. This season add a vertical element to your perennial bed or garden with a trellis or rose dome planted with colorful blossoms.

- Keep new plants watered.

- Side dress with compost for mid-season pick up.
- Check foliage for nutrient deficiencies.
- Put houseplants outdoors in the shade.
- Keep deadheading for long season bloom
- Pinch back fall blooming Mums, Asters, Monardia.
- Stake tomato plants.
- Maintenance trims on wisteria.
