SPRING CONTAINERS: PLANT OUT OF THE BOX

Container gardening has grown immensely in popularity in the past few years and with good reasons. They



add drama to entrances and create beautiful vignettes from the inside looking out. Containers help to extend the garden visually beyond its normal boundaries, from under trees where nothing thrives, to soil less places like the rooftops of buildings, decks or patios.

This year try something new in containers; plant herbs, vegetables, fruit, roses, perennials, tropicals, or trees.



Put more fun in cooking by having a container herb garden near the kitchen. Plant a variety of herbs that can be snipped and added to meals. This strawberry pot makes a complete kitchen garden at your door.

Some people shy away from growing roses because they presume it will be difficult. Growing roses in containers is easy. Potted roses can be placed in the ideal location with the best light and air circulation; the color of a glazed terra cotta con-



tainer can be the perfect complement to the color of a rose. Elevating a rose in a container brings the rose closer to eye level and allows us to more fully appreciate its beauty and fragrance.

Trees can be grown in containers on a patio to screen a less than perfect view. Trees in pots can create the illu-



sion of an abundant garden, take the sharpness off of a corner, or make a patio look much larger. With containers your garden can be more lush and beautiful and be a little different every year.

MAY TO DO LIST

- Gently clean up flower beds if not already done.
- Top dress afterward with organic fertilizer, compost, and a layer of fine, dark mulch.
- Edge beds to make a clean defining line.
- Deadhead spring bulbs as blooms fade, but leave foliage intact to ripen bulbs naturally.
- Put grow through supports on peonies.
- Watch for aphids and spider mites.
- Prune Forsythia and feed.
- Plant lettuce, asparagus, spinach, beans.
- Plant herbs.
- Trim thyme before it flowers.
- Feed lawn with high nitrogen fertilizer and water in.
- Deadhead spent perennials unless they have showy seed heads or you want to collect seed later.
- Divide iris after bloom.
- Check trees and shrubs for bagworms, borers and winter burn.
- Clean out birdbaths.
- Refresh outdoor furniture and pillows.
- Entertain outdoors!
