TRENDING IN THE 2016 GARDEN

PERENNIAL PLANT OF 2016

The Perennial Plant Association has chosen the Japanese Anemone 'Honorine Jobert' as the 2016 Perennial of the year.



A 5' tall, elegant, woody based perennial, it has dazzling white flowers. It has a double row of petals, giving it substance. Its flowers are held on graceful, upright stems for five weeks. It looks lovely massed in woodland areas or in rock gardens. It is excellent as a cut flower.

The variety has been around for approximately 150 years. It was a "sport", a spontaneous offspring, of the pale pink Anemone x hybrida raised at the Royal Horticulture Society's garden in Chiswick in 1848. The white flower occurred 10 years later on a plant in France that had been grown in England. Soon after, Honorine Jobert made the trip back across the Channel into England.

FEBRUARY TO DO LIST

- Plant and/or transplant trees and shrubs. It is too late when the buds swell.
- Feed trees, shrubs, evergreens, and roses. Water in well.
- Spray dormant oil on roses to eliminate pests and their eggs.
- Start feeding houseplants with fertilizer strength diluted 50%.
- Feed the birds to keep them nesting in your garden; they eat a lot of insects.
- Start dividing perennials that need it.
- *Carefully* prune *SUMMER BLOOMING* shrubs, tangled honeysuckle.
- *AFTER* their blooms fade, prune forsythia, quince.
- Water deeply periodically.
- Water prior to winter weather event to help hydrate and insulate plants.
- February 8-10 last bulb planting days.
- Examine, clean, and maintain tools.
