## COOLING FOUNTAINS

July is fountain month at Wilshire Garden Market. The sight and sound of falling water in a fountain always makes us feel cooler and calmer. Fountain is a word derived from the Latin word *fontis*, meaning spring.



Regardless of its size, a fountain can be beneficial. A small fountain placed on a nearby table soothes and relaxes an outdoor reader, making precious solitary moments even more enjoyable.

A walled garden with a fountain becomes your own cool green haven, a peaceful place to escape from stress, to smell fragrant flowers, watch birds and listen to all of the sounds of nature. Our lightweight, durable fiberglass wall fountains have the appearance of lead, iron, or limestone; they are simple to install.



A fountain fills a lifeless corner, adds sparkle to a pathway, or graces the center of your garden. Birds are attracted to moving water, adding life to the garden. Fountains can be connected to sprinkler



systems for carefree filling. Every garden should have at least one fountain!

## OOH LA LA! FRENCH SOAP!

There are several products from the store that we both use and enjoy on a daily basis: the outdoor pillows and rugs, our fountains, wind chimes, and our lovingly planted glazed terra cotta and cast stone containers. The one item that gets overlooked is the soap that we sell. Years ago at market, we were literally drawn in to a showroom filled with an intoxicatingly wonderful scent. A decade later we are still enjoying, selling, and introducing new customers to the best soaps in the world.

This soap is made by the same centuries old process. The 150 gram soaps are enriched with shea butter, contain pure and natural ingredients, and are quadruple milled. This means that the soap is passed through the mill four times, completely infusing the essential oils and creating a dense, hard soap that will not melt onto the side of the tub or sink. Allowed to dry after use on a soap dish, these soaps will outlast other soaps, and will produce a rich, thick lather even from a thin wafer.



Some soaps include visible bits of rose petals, leaves, seeds, rind and lavender blossoms which aid to exfoliate dead skin cells leaving skin renewed and soft. The delicate scent of the soap fills the wash room with its wonderful aroma that can be enjoyed even when not in use. The soap is free of parabens, ethyl alcohol, DEA, Phenoxyethanol, and there is no animal testing.



The newest product is the Gardener's soap, which was a 2010 NY Gift Show Best New Product finalist. It was inspired by the enduring rustic life of Provence that is centered on living, working and being in nature. Natural exfoliants and cornmeal help to gently remove soil, comfrey aids in healing skin from any minor scrapes, while



shea and cocoa butters moisturize leaving skin feeling soft and clean. The four natural scents to choose from are reminiscent of the colorful, flower-strewn meadows of Provence: lavender rose, rosemary mint, fresh basil, and bergamot.

Shea butter is derived from the nut of the karite tree which thrives amid the harsh, arid conditions in central Africa. Shea butter is one of nature's best moisturizers; it is naturally gentle yet provides intense healing for dry skin, cuticles, lips and hair. One of the most luxurious soaps is the 20% shea butter hand cut soap. The natural scent has a clean, pure aroma with a thick lather that is nourishing to the skin. Europeans apply the 100% shea butter, a thick cream, to their hair thirty minutes before shampooing as a deep conditioner; it leaves hair thick, shiny and soft.



The extra fragrant honey soap, embossed with a traditional French bee, is made by an esteemed soap-making family who has been in business since 1812. It is made with natural, biodegradable ingredients, pure vegetable oil, and contains no artificial colors. This soap is triple milled, renders a rich lather, leaving your skin



soft and clean. The honey lavender soap is made with honey collected near Provence lavender fields. Its sweet, soothing scent fills the bath with the air of Provence. The 250 gr. bars are wonderful for long soothing baths and last for weeks. We appreciate these small luxuries and how they enhance our daily lives!

A few days after the flower is pollinated, the stem tightens into a spring to bring it under the water, where it develops into a spongy berry with up to 2,000 seeds.
