FOUNTAINS IN WINTER

Campania has introduced many lovely new fountain designs in new sizes to fit a variety of home and garden situations. Their new mid-size will make it possible for more people to have fountains on patios, porches, sunrooms, and in the garden, calming all with their peaceful sights and sounds.

We could not resist the Rochefort, reminiscent of a courtyard fountain in Provence. You can have a lot of fun with this fountain, giving a small space the look and feel of a European garden.



The Disappearing Leaf Sculpture Fountain is possibly the most striking cast stone fountain we have ever seen; amazing detail. The Campania sculptor cast this from a real leaf, taking weeks to create a latex mold. The fiberglass basin housing the pump can be buried below ground or screened by stones and plant material. Imagine how pretty this fountain would look and how wonderful it would sound nestled among ferns and hostas in a lush shade dappled garden.



A bit smaller still, the new Garden Terrace Series features simple, visually soothing designs. The Equinox, shown here, leans toward the contemporary; it makes a great tabletop or console accent.



Protect your fountain in winter. We suggest removing the water and covering your fountain to protect it and the pump from damage. Freezing water expands; if water is trapped as it expands, cracking is likely to occur. You can order a professional waterproof fountain cover size-specific for your fountain, or create your own. In mild winters, we have sometimes filled the empty bowls of fountains with evergreen boughs that causes any small amount of freezing rain or snow to crack upwards and the cold temperatures keeps the evergreens looking good for weeks. Bottom line, the cover is the sure thing.
